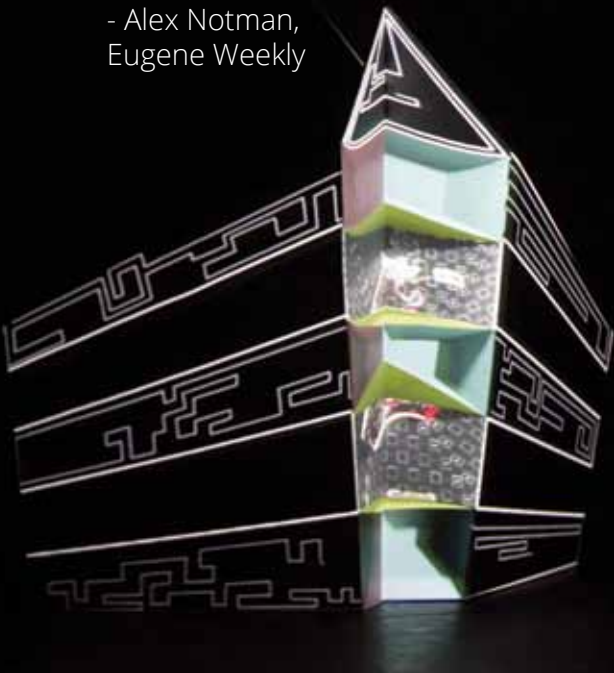

Tailored for digital art, music technology, or dance classes, students discover the physical and technical experiences of the work and gain a more profound level of ownership.
